A Bengali architect Vidhyadhar Bhattacharya used the guiding principles of Shilpa Shastra (the science of Indian architecture) to design the entire city. An architectural and urban planning wonder aside, the city is steeped in India's rich cultural heritage and is the center of the mighty Rajput heritage.

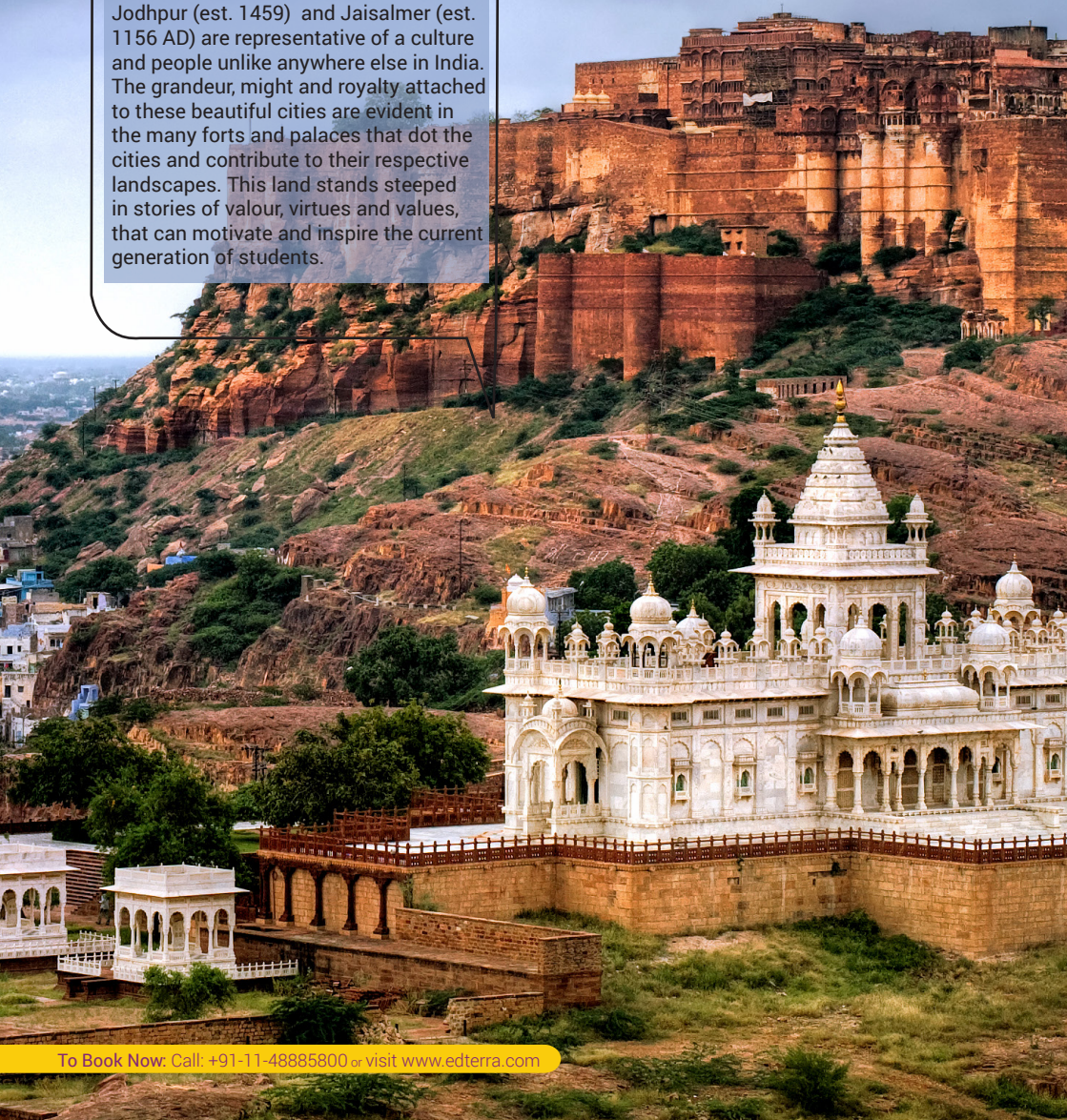

WHY DID WE CHOOSE **KERALA?**

Kochi, known as the Queen of the Arabian Sea, was an important spice trading center on the west coast of India from the 14th century. Steeped in historical relevance, Kochi was the first of the European colonies (Portuguese) in colonial India. Munnar offers unparalleled scenic beauty and for once the comparisons of an Indian tourist spot with typical European counterparts is justified. Thekkady has one of the world's most fascinating natural wildlife reserves - the Periyar Wildlife Sanctuary. Alleppey is the Venice of India with its numerous bridges that serve as a lifeline for the local people who lead a very earthy and traditional life.

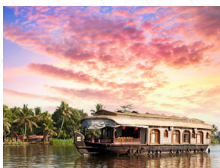

WHY DID WE CHOOSE **RANTHAMBORE?**

A former hunting ground of the Maharajas of Jaipur, the Ranthambore National Park is today a major wildlife tourist attraction. Its dense tiger population and easy sighting opportunities attract many wildlife photographers and conservationists from all parts of the world. This is one of the rare parks where tiger population is extensively documented and students can be made aware of the life history of each tiger and understand firsthand the issues related to tiger conservation.

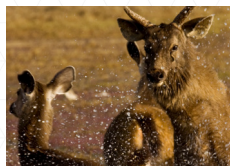

WHY DID WE CHOOSE **UDAIPUR & CHITTORGARH?**

The Sisodia clan of Rajputs ruled Mewar and Chittorgarh was initially their capital. It was eventually shifted to Udaipur by Maharana Udai Singh. The Kingdom of Mewar became part of Rajasthan in independent India. Apart from its historical relevance, Udaipur has emerged as a popular tourist destination known for its Rajput-era palaces, especially the marvelous Lake Palace that occupies an entire island on the lake.

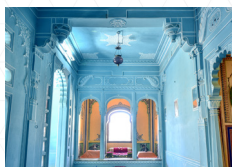

The Indian Golden Triangle is the only journey where you can look at three contrasting dynasties and kingdoms separated by time and distance. Delhi was home to the Delhi Sultanate (1206 – 1526) that paved the way for the Mughals (1526-1857) who transitorily opted for Agra as their capital city and from whence the Mughal Dynasty flourished. 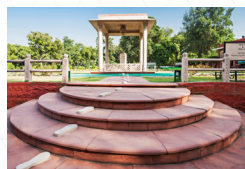




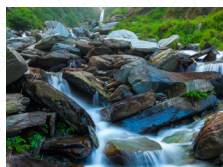
